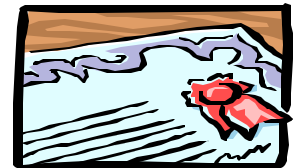

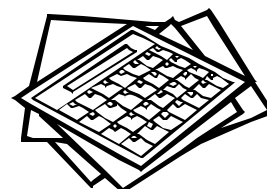

The Region Directors meeting involved an update from each of the Region Officers on the activities and progress of each area they are responsible for managing. The

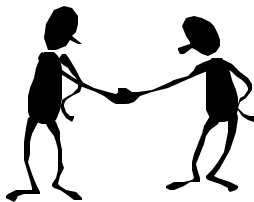

KENNETH R KRUGH JR, CCP, CDP RECEIVES LIFETIME PERFORMANCE AWARD

On January 16, 2001, AITP Pittsburgh Chapter Director, Kenneth Krugh Jr. CCP, CDP, received the Lifetime Performance Award at the January dinner meeting.

The Lifetime Performance Award is one of the highest Individual Performance Awards (IPAs) that an individual AITP member can attain. To receive this awards, a member must attain 800 IPA points. With the current point structure and maximum allowable points for each year, it takes at least 24



years of sustained active membership to receive this award.

Mr. Krugh currently serves as the Pitts-

burgh chapter's director in charge of Records and Labels and Awards. Over the years he has served on nearly every chapter committee and in every chapter board of director position. He also served as Chapter President. Ken was also involved with the Region conference in 1987.

Mr. Krugh is most deserving of this award. Please join the Pittsburgh Chapter board of directors in congratulating him for attaining this award.
