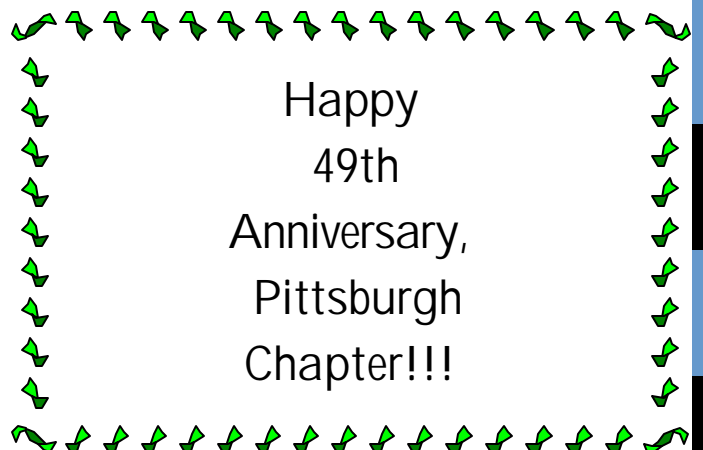
iServe Technologies is a managed services provider located in the Strip District. They provide ASP, application hosting and managed network services.

is Westinghouse?). Yet, our organization is preparing to celebrate its 50th anniversary. If you look at many other volunteer trade



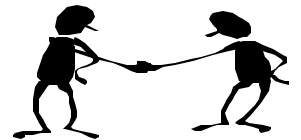
organizations, you will find very few that have come close to that milestone.
