

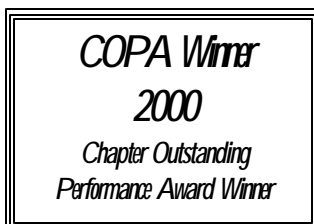

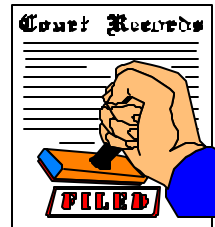

## LIMITING LIABILITY WHEN EMPLOYEES SURF Heather Heidelbaugh, Burns, White and Hickton

As IT professionals, we know that technology moves fast. We've also heard that the wheels of justice turn slowly. However, if you're not careful, those wheels may run you over!

As employees have access to more technology, the potential for misuse increases exponentially. So does the potential liability for employers. But, we also live in a society that places a high value on individual rights. How can employers develop (and enforce) an employee

policy that provides protection for both parties?

Heather Heidelbaugh of Burns, White and Hickton, will be our featured speaker in September and shed some light on this topic. Heather is the Chairperson of her firm's ECommerce Department and works daily to help her clients deal with the legal issues that arise as they use technology more.

Heather developed her specialty as awareness of Y2K

problem (you do remember that?) began to develop. She realized that lawyers needed to get more familiar with the technology to help clients in an emerging field. She even testified before the Pennsylvania State Senate hearings regarding legislation limiting liability for Y2K issues. While she doesn't consider herself a technie, she looks to understand the legal issues presented by technical advances.

#### TRIBUTE TO THE UNITED STATES

By a Canadian newspaper journalist

America: The Good Neighbor.

"This Canadian thinks it is time to speak up for the Americans as the most generous and possibly the least appreciated people on all the earth.

Germany, Japan and, to a lesser extent, Britain and Italy were lifted out of the debris of war by the Americans who poured in billions of dollars and forgave other billions in debt. None of these countries is today paying even the interest on its remaining debts to the United States.

When France was in danger of collapsing in 1956, it was

the Americans who propped it up, and their reward was to be insulted and swindled on the streets of Paris. I was there. I saw it.

I can name you 5000 times when the Americans raced to the help of other people in trouble. Can you name me even one time when someone else raced to the Americans in trouble? I don't think there was outside help even during the San Francisco earthquake.

Our neighbors have faced it alone, and I'm one Canadian who is damned tired of hearing them get kicked around. They will come out of this thing with their flag high. And when they do, they are entitled to thumb their nose at the lands that are gloating over their present troubles. I hope Canada is not one of those."

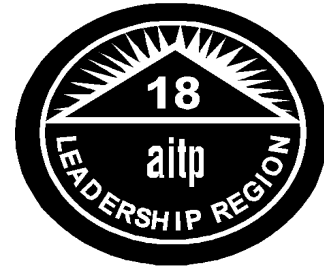

## WORD PLAY ON THE INTERNET BY ROBIN NOBLES

If you're interested in "words"--in what they mean, how to use them, and where they came from--you're in luck on the Internet.

Have you ever wondered where phrases such as "bite the bullet" or "kiss of death" came from? At the **Origin of Phrases** (<http://members.aol.com/MorelandC/Phrases.htm>), you'll learn that the term "raining cats and dogs" may have originated from the time of the bubonic plague in London, where cats and dogs were also afflicted, many dying in the streets. After a particularly hard rain, street gutters would be flooded with the bodies of cats and dogs.

An excellent site for exploring the English language is the **World Wide Word Home Page** (<http://www.quinion.com/words/>) The page is devoted to the English language, to "its history, quirks, curiosities and evolution." Click on Weird Words to learn of odd words such as "eleemosynary," which means "charitable." Submit a question to learn the origin of certain phrases or words, or study words or phrases that aren't in dictionaries yet, like "genetic pollution."

At the **Literary Dictionary** (<http://www.geocities.com/SoHo/Lofts/2297/literary.html>) you can study words that first made an appearance in books, plays, poems, comic strips, and mythology. For example, the word "accept" first appeared in Geoffrey Chaucer's



The Canterbury Tales in 1387. "Aerial" first appeared in William Shakespeare's Othello in 1604.

Visit **The Quotations Page** (<http://www.quotationspage.com/>) Where you can read motivational quotes of the day, or even contribute a favorite quotation. Search the site by keyword to find quotations that use that word from among twelve different quotation sources. A search for "computer" brought this quote, among others: "Computers are useless. They can only give you answers," by Pablo Picasso (1881-1973).

The **Web of On-line Dictionaries** (<http://www.facstaff.bucknell.edu/rbeard/diction.html>) offers more than 800 dictionaries in 60 different languages. Whoa. The site also includes thesauri and other vocabulary aids, such as acronym dictionaries, synonym dictionaries, rhyming dictionaries, and more. It's a very impressive site.

At the **Phrase Finder** (<http://www.shu.ac.uk/web-admin/phrases/>), you can insert a word, and it will return a set of phrases that are related to the word in some way. Or, you can browse their complete list of phrases, including their meanings and derivations.

Finally, for a listing of links to sites that "feature fun with words," visit **Word Play**. (<http://www.wolinskyweb.com/word.htm>). Among the numerous links too many to count, you'll find a link to Puzzle-maker, a site that lets you create customized puzzles such as word search, criss-cross, cryptograms, fallen phrases, and more.
